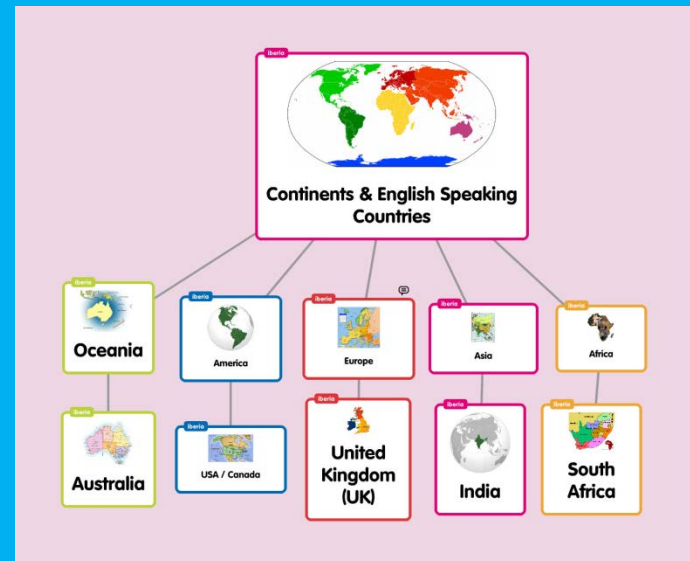

Organizing / classifying / pre-writing

Inspiration / Popplet

- Free “lite” version
- Allows brainstorming / preplanning
- Could be useful for:
 - Creating an outline before a writing assignment
 - Remembering / organizing a written text
 - Sharing your ideas with your teacher before the writing stage



Dropbox & Google Drive

Sharing & saving information

- Cloud based
- Create account (free) on all of your devices



Apps for note-taking

- Audio note (lite version)
- Dragon Dictate
- Notability \$
- Doc Scan / Tiny Scan



Audio Note (\$ - lite free)

- Useful for in class note taking
- Playback feature
- Allows for:
 - Recording of voice
 - Input of text, images, pictures



Notability (\$)

- Same features as Audio Note
- Allows for PDF annotation



Dragon Dictate (free)

- Voice recognition app
- Allows you to dictate your words and create text
- Can be uploaded to dropbox, saved or emailed
- Need to “train” your voice



Apps for word processing / reading comprehension

- Kurzweil / firefly
- Natural reader
- Overdrive
- Ibooks
- dictionary



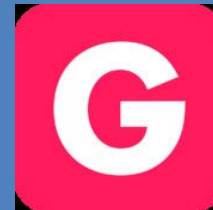
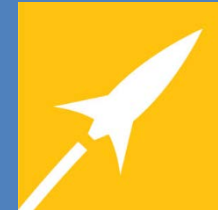
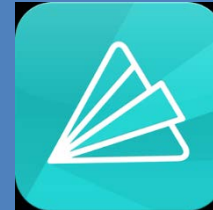
Firefly (Kurzweil) / Natural Reader

- Both of these apps allow you to upload text and have it read to you.
- Can alter speed / voice / pacing
- Web version includes dictionary, study tools, writing features
- School laptops have kurzweil

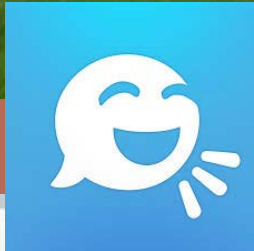


Haiku Deck

- Presentation program (app & web)
- Allows selection of theme, uploads of images (creative commons)
- Visually appealing
- Variety of layouts



Tellagami



- Allows you to create an avatar to share your presentation
- Select character, background
- Record your own voice
- Ideal for the “nervous” presenter

Apps for life
